

Acepromazine® (Promace®)

Acepromazine is a tranquilizer, and is labeled for use to sedate animals for minor procedures (e.g., nail trims), alleviate itching, and prevent vomiting due to motion sickness in dogs and cats. It may also be used prior to anesthesia and surgery. It is not a pain reliever. Dose varies widely between individuals. Can make aggressive tendencies worse or more unpredictable. Do not use in animals with liver disease, a history of seizures, or in those who are pregnant. Contact your veterinarian if your pet experiences excessive sedation, pale gums, unconsciousness, or seizures while being treated with acepromazine.

Keep this and all other medications out of the reach of children and pets.
